

Stacy Dodd

From the depths of a 20-year struggle with homelessness and addiction to becoming a nationally recognized interventionist, nonprofit founder, author, and community leader, Stacy Dodd's life is a powerful testament to the transformative power of recovery, faith, and second chances.

Based in North Mississippi, Stacy is a Certified Intervention Professional (CIP) credentialed by the Pennsylvania Certification Board, a member of the Association of Intervention Specialists (AIS), and a NAADAC Nationally Certified Addiction Interventionist. He serves as Territory Manager for North Mississippi at Woodland Recovery Center (formerly Turning Point Recovery / Bradford Health Services), where he has dedicated more than a decade of service—celebrating 10 years with the organization in 2025 and receiving the organization's 10-Year Service Award and earlier Circle of Excellence Award.

In 2025, Stacy founded Stacy Dodd Interventions, LLC, a mobile intervention practice that compassionately guides families, friends, and organizations through ethical and effective interventions for substance use disorders, process addictions, and mental health challenges.

As CEO and co-founder of the Hope Center of North Mississippi, Stacy has built a thriving one-to-one mentoring program for at-risk youth in grades 3–12. The Hope Center is a Silver Level Affiliate of the Memphis Grizzlies Foundation Mentoring Program and has been honored as Mentoring Program of the Year. Stacy himself has been named Mentoring Advocate of the Year by the MENTOR Memphis Grizzlies Foundation (in both 2023 and 2026) and has received the Community Service Award from the Hope Center.

Stacy's extensive community leadership includes serving on the Board of Directors of the Southaven Chamber of Commerce, where he also holds the role of Government & Community Relations Committee Chair and has previously served as Ambassador Chair. He is the DeSoto County Leader for the Spiritual Care Network of the Midsouth and the Celebrate Recovery Inside State Representative for North Mississippi and the Memphis Metro. For more than 15 years, he has served as a Ministry Leader at the DeSoto County Adult Detention Center. An ordained minister since 2016, he also volunteers as a pastor with Ibanda Full Gospel Church in Uganda.

His many honors include Southaven's Man of the Year (2022), Non-Profit Leader of the Year (2023), Ambassador of the Year from both the Southaven Chamber of Commerce and the Greater Memphis Chamber of Commerce (2022), Man of the Year from the Horn Lake Chamber of Commerce (2017), and the 2024 Kindle Award for Philanthropy. He has also served on the Mississippi Veterans Task Force and held roles including Certified Peer Support Specialist Supervisor with the Mississippi Department of Mental Health.

A published author, Stacy has written five books—*Backpack to the 'Burbs*, *Outcast to Executive*, *God's Rocks*, *Backpack and Beyond*, and *The Fire Inside*. He has another book, *The Interventionists*, scheduled for release in 2026-2027.

Stacy resides in DeSoto County with his wife, Stephanie. Together they have two children, Kate and Dustin, and four grandchildren.

His life's work continues to be driven by a simple conviction: no one is beyond hope, and every person deserves the chance to rewrite their story.
